Introduction

In ancient times, a man named Daniel lived as a refugee in a foreign land. Daniel had some real challenges to overcome. Captured by a Babylonian empire who placed him in a training program designed to strip him of his Hebrew identity and values. Daniel continually stood when he was commanded to kneel and kneeled when he was commanded to stand. His courage, conviction and character set him apart from all the other young men of his generation, and by God's hand of guidance, he ascended to a place of great success. Daniel is an incredible example for every man who wants to become stand out husbands, fathers and leaders who shine like stars in a culture not too different from Babylon. In this closer examination of one passage of Scripture, we discover how a man is transformed when he knows he is greatly loved by God.

"Those who are wise will shine as bright as the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness will shine like the stars forever." Daniel 12:3

A Man's Identity Is Defined By Love (continued)

Man... hear this... you are greatly loved by God. You are greatly loved by the creator of the universe. You are called "beloved" by the perfect Heavenly Father. Your identity is found in this reality, that God's infinite love for you is completely independent of your successes or failures, good works or sins, accomplishments or unrealized goals. There is nothing that you can do to make God love you any more or less than He does right now. Over four additional chapters, we will dig deeper into the immense implications of what happens when a man knows he is greatly loved by God. Rest and reflect on this pivotal truth today, "O man, you are greatly loved."

- What is a truth from God that you need to be continually reminded of?
- ♣ How is your identity and self-worth shaped by a love that is not measured by your own performance, success or accomplishment?
- * How does being loved unconditionally and infinitely by God help you love your spouse, children or loved ones differently?




He will... Fear Not

Fear is a wicked master. The fear of man can cause even the most gifted, powerful and influential leaders to crumble in compromise (1 Samuel 15:24). Fear drove Adam to hide from God after his sin in the garden (Genesis 3:10). Indeed, extinguishing an unhealthy fear is at the top of the list for God's commandments- "Do not fear" is the most repeated command in all of scripture. Yet, Solomon also teaches that "the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." Proverbs 9:10

To be fully known and to be fully loved is the true antithesis of fear. Most men believe that if all of their warts, weaknesses and wickedness were exposed, there would be no way that anyone could love or respect them. So in fear, men push down insecurity and try to cover it up with accomplishment, bravado and self-aggrandizing behavior.

When a man knows he is greatly loved by God, he understands that God has seen him both for what He is and what He will be in in Christ. To truly love a man means to recognize his problems and realize his potential.



He will... Fear Not (Continued)

REFLECTION:

- * What does it mean to be "fully known and fully loved"?
- If you were "exposed" for who you really are, what would happen?
- How would entering into an honest, authentic relationship with God help you overcome fear?
- Why is it important to have friendships with other men whom you can have this kind of authentic, honest relationship?

He will... Experience Peace

When a man knows he is greatly loved, he carries with him a calming sense of peace. Just as Jesus was able to sleep soundly on a ship in a storm, so to a man who is fully aware of his Father's loving and protective embrace will experience a "sweet sleep," devoid of fear and anxiety (Proverbs 3:24). This "peace that surpasses all understanding" (Philippians 4:7) is built on the affirmation of two questions- 1. Is God powerful enough to handle all of my anxieties? 2. Does God love me? When a man determines in his heart that the answer to both of these questions is a resounding "yes," he cannot help but conclude that whatever storm he may be encountering at the moment will not result in a sinking ship. God is a good Father and he will protect and provide for His children accordingly (Matthew 7:9-11). Consider this, even the discipline we endure from God is born out of a heart of love and a commitment to our well-being (Hebrews 12:5-7).



He will... Experience Peace (Continued)

Additionally, modern psychologists agree that boundaries and blessings contribute to positive mental health and internal peace in the lives of children. A father's loving discipline is a way to pass on peace to his children.

Furthermore, the peace of God is a direct outpouring of peace with God (Romans 5:1). When we abide in God's love and embrace the loving commands of God, an overflow of joy and peace flows from our hearts (John 15:9-11). We receive the peace of God from the God of peace "at all times in every way." (2 Thessalonians 3:16)

A man who knows he is greatly loved by God is not devoid of struggle or suffering, but he has come to a place in his heart where he can confidently echo the words of the hymn writer Horatio Spafford who wrote, "When peace, like a river, attendeth my way, When sorrows like sea billows roll; Whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, It is well, it is well with my soul."



He will... Experience Peace (Continued)

REFLECTION:

- Consider the two questions mentioned above- 1) Do I believe God is powerful enough to handle all of my anxieties? 2) Do I believe that God loves me?
- If you answered "yes" to both of those questions, what worries or problems do you need to release back to God?
- How do God's boundaries and discipline bring you peace? How does that inspire you in your role as a father?
- ❖ The hymn writer wrote... "Thou hast taught me to say, 'it is well, it is well with my soul." How does God teach us to experience peace in the middle of a storm?



He will... Be Strong

Going to the gym can be an intimidating experience for a "regular guy." Struggling to curl 25lb barbells while the Rock's stunt double beside you is bench pressing the Titanic can leave you feeling pretty flimsy. Traditionally, men are expected to "be strong." True strength, however, is not revealed in a gym, but in a trial. Daniel knew what it meant to be strong. He had stood strong in his resolve not to compromise his obedience to God in his dietary restrictions (Daniel 1:8-16) Daniel was strong in his faith that God would give him the wisdom to stand before the King and interpret his dream (Daniel 2:17-49). Daniel was strong in his conviction to pray no matter what the consequences might be, even being thrown into a lions' den would not stop him (Daniel 6). Now, in this moment, Daniel felt weak, "for now no strength remains in me, and no breath is left in me." Daniel 10:17.

In this moment of weakness, we get a glimpse into the source of Daniel's immense strength. Daniel recounts that God "touched me and strengthened me" (v.18), "he spoke to me, I was strengthened" (v. 19). What words did the Lord use to impart strength to Daniel? "O man greatly loved..." (v. 19).



He will... Be Strong (Continued)

The strength to stand and endure with conviction and compassion is not rooted in our own personal will power, but in the sufficiency of God's love and grace. God did not tell Daniel to "try harder," or ask him to prove his love for God. Rather, he told Daniel, you are "greatly loved" and because of my incredible love for you, you can "be strong." When a man realizes that it is in weakness he is made strong, the charade of self-will is replaced by the sincerity of divine love.

"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."."



He will... Be Courageous

The most courageous displays of bravery are always motivated by love and for love. Courage is summoned when the love we have for someone else or the love one has for us is greater than the risk, danger or sacrifice that lies before us. Christ is the ultimate exemplar of courage. Knowing that the cross was his destiny, Jesus came to this earth, lived humbly as a carpenter's son and spent three years as a misunderstood itinerant preacher who was reviled by the the religious establishment. In his final moments preceding his arrest, trial and execution, Jesus was so stricken with anxiety, grief and sorrow, he experienced a rare clinical phenomenon known as hematrohidrosis, which is the sweating of blood from intense anxiety. "Being in agony he prayed more earnestly; and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground." Luke 22:44 In this enfeebled state, Jesus prayed his most courageous prayer, "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me. Nevertheless, not my will, but yours, be done." Luke 22:42. Here we see that in spite of the great suffering that stood before him, the love that Jesus had for us was far greater than the cup of agony which Jesus bore for our sins.





REFLECTION:

- How did Jesus' act of love inspired courage bring you your salvation and eternal life?
- What is the difference between the commands, "do not fear," and "be courageous"?
- * How does it require courage to be a great husband or father?
- What is one courageous step you can take to love others more sacrificially?

"Fear can paralyze, but courage will catalyze our faith to action."
